
COLLECT FOR PURITY

Which of these three, do you think, proved neighbor to the man who fell among the robbers?" He said, "The one who showed mercy on him." And Jesus said to him, "Go and do likewise."








THE BREAKING OF THE BREAD – CHRIST OUR PASSOVER
